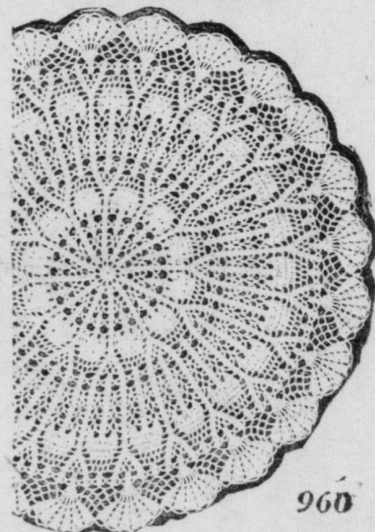

The ladies auxiliary to the Mount Joy fire company will have a dance Saturday nite, June 12, from 7 to 10 p.m. in the fire hall.

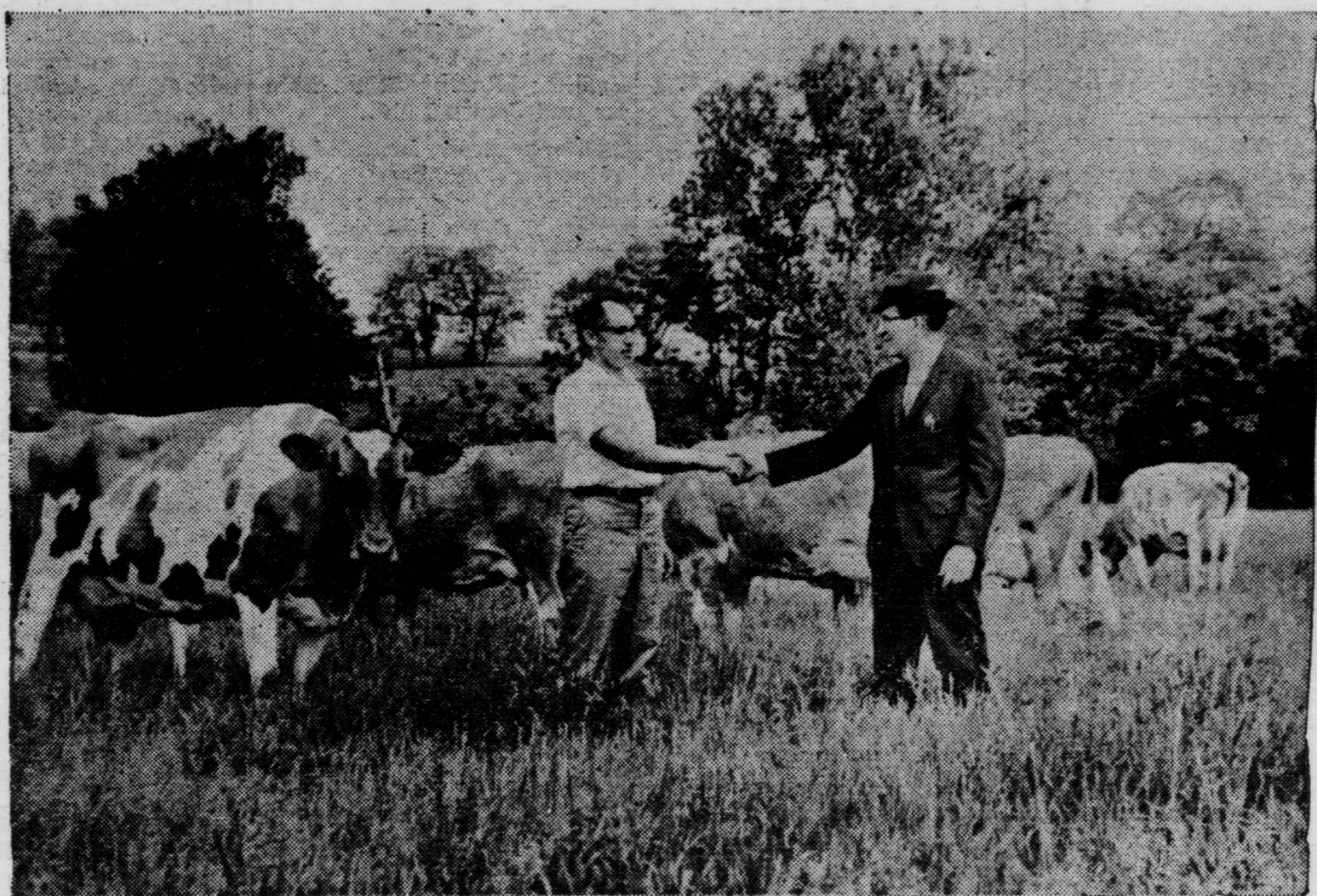
### CLEOPATRA CENTERPIECE

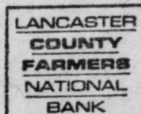
