The Hempfield Union School District has announced the summer playground program, Landisville, Rohrertown and East Petersburg opened on June 28 and will close on August 6. Hours are from 8 a.m. to 12 noon at each of the elementary school buildings — Mountville will open July 6 and close August 13 with the same hours as above. Farmdale Elementary School playground will not open this summer due to the building program.
