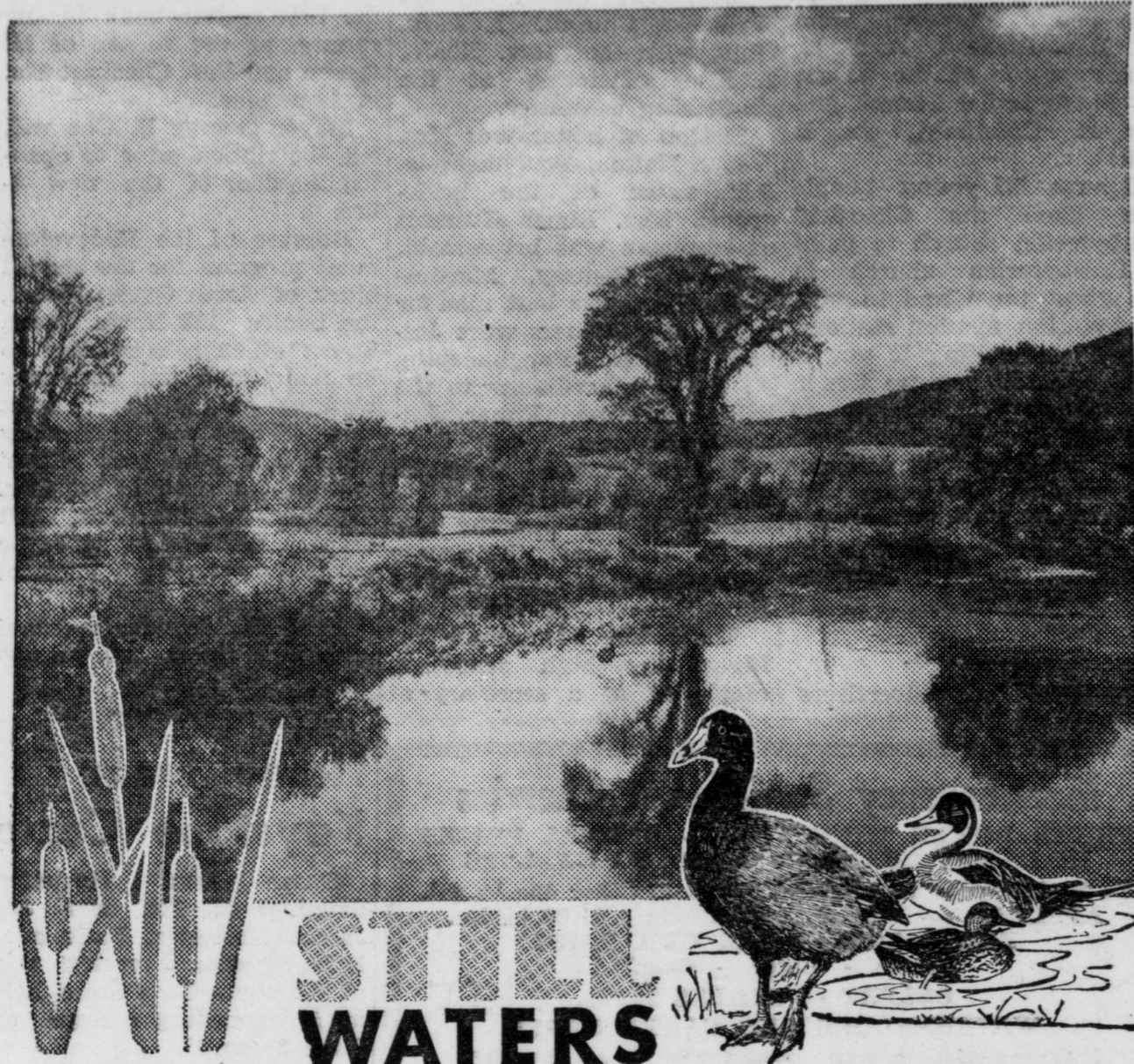


GO TO Church on Sunday
