AN ORDINANCE

ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY.

It is hereby ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

WHEREAS, a petition has been presented to the Bor- for Miss Mabel Walmer. ough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy by National-Standard Company, requesting the Borough to annex to itself and make part of the Borough, certain land hereinafter described, situated in Rapho Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, which is a second class township. And it is represented to Council by said petition that the monthly Happy Hour meeting be considered by the entire said petitioner constitutes a majority in number of the freeholders of the said territory and it has been certified by the petitioner that a copy of the petition was duly filed with the Supervisors of Rapho Township, therefore:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council bereby approves the Harold Kuhn in Lancaster. said petition and the Borough of Mount Joy hereby annexes to the Borough the following described land situated in said Rapho Township, and adjoining the Borough, to

BEGINNING at a point in the center line of Lancaster and Harrisburg State Highway, (Pa. Legislative Route 129), a corner of land of John Haines; thence extending along the center line of said Highway, the following two courses and distances: (1) North 88 degrees 49 minutes East, 1594.48 feet to a point, and (2), in a line curving to

the right having a radius of 5729.70 feet, an arc distance EVANGELISTIC SERVICES of 188.50 feet, the chord of said arc being, North 89 degrees 45 minutes 30 seconds East, a distance of 188 50 feet to a point in line of land of Joseph B. Hostetter; thence along said Hostetter land services at the Florin Church South 2 degrees 27 minutes of the Brethren. East, 803.81 feet to an iron pin in the North right of way line of land of Pennsylvania Railroad Co. (said last mentioned course in 10.0 feet west of the middle of a 9 feet wide dirt lane; thence along said Harner land, North 3 degrees 09 minutes West, 599.34 feet to the place of beginning. CONTAINING 28.696 acres.

SECTION 2. This annexation shall not be deemed to constitute an acceptance as a Borough street, of any street or alley in the territory annexed, except such, if any, as now constitute public township roads in Rapho Town-
