the teaching position until that time, Miss Jo Anne Martin, a 1961 graduate of Donegal high school and of Juniata college, was named a substitute.

Mrs. Marianne Achorn of Elizabethtown was elected to be a special helper in the reading program at Donegal Annex.

Surplus equipment from the vocational - agriculture department, which was closed this fall, has been sold. Much of the property went to other schools. Sale totaled \$443.40.

A number of wooden, tablet armed chairs owned by the school are to be sold on a cash and carry basis from the Annex. Price is 50c each.

Authorization was given to procure protective eye equipment mandated for certain shops and laboratories. The state is requiring these safety devices.

The board decided to negotiate settlement for damages which are anticipated will be done to the Governor Dick property as the state begins a "crash" program to straighten curves on Route 72 between Bismark Till and the Turnpike interchange. A little more than two acres of the school property is involved.

The Henry S. Rich Agency of Marietta was named broker of record to handle all insurance for the school district and to distribute insurance coverage to the various agents in the school area.

Consider Various Sink Models Before Buying:

Are you in the market for a new kitchen sink? If so, the first decision you should make is to decide whether you want porcelain or stainless steel.

Porcelain sinks come in a range of colors so you have a choice to fit your color scheme. Select an acid-resistant porcelain because fruits and vegetables can stain the finish. Also remember that porcelain varies in quality.

Not all stainless steel sinks

are of equal quality. Look for spotless acid-resistant stainless steel with enough nickel in the steel to give good service. Fixtures also vary in quality and type of level so look at many models before making a decision. The trend now seems to be back with drainboards. Women have found drainboards are a convenience and are requesting them.

Most women who have used the two-bowl and the single-bowl prefer the double bowls. Three-bowl, tri-level sinks are also available. Where garbage disposers are used, a three-level bowl sink is advantage. A corner sink may be desired if a kitchen has corner windows. Many women, however, find two sinks at right angles are awkward to use. A dishwasher should not be installed directly next to such a sink. Twelve to fifteen inches should be left between the

sink and the dishwasher to allow ample space for loading and unloading the washer.
