
She is a member of the Mount Joy Mennonite church and it is no surprise that she is the oldest member of the congregation.

Cartoons lasting one hour and a half will be shown, after which Santa Claus will distribute treats.


While the party is going on, the Legion also will be distributing its baskets of food to the needy.
