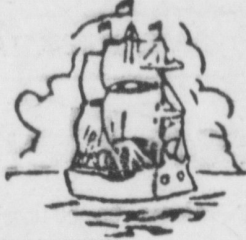

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## LEGAL NOTICES

### NOTICE

#### TO THE RESIDENTS OF LANCASTER COUNTY, PA. RETURNS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

For the Calendar Year Ending December 31, 1965  
Subject to Taxation For County Purposes At the Rate of Four Mills on the Dollar

#### PAYABLE DURING THE YEAR 1966

UNDER the Provisions of the Act of June 17, 1913 and The Supplement and Amendments Thereto.

Every resident, individual, copartnership, company or corporation in the City and County of Lancaster, holding personal property taxable under the Act of June 17, 1913, P.L. 507 and amendments, is required by law to file a return thereof to the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, stating the market value thereof as of December 31, 1965. Returns to be made between January 2, 1966 and February 15, 1966. Blank forms for Returns have been mailed; and if you did not receive a blank return, one may be obtained at the office of the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, 36 N. Duke Street Lancaster, Pa.

**PENALTY: FAILURE TO FILE RETURN ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 15, 1966, THE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX BUREAU WILL ENTER AGAINST YOU AN ESTIMATED ASSESSMENT, TO WHICH WILL BE ADDED A PENALTY OF 12%.**

Following is a partial list of personal property subject to tax: Mortgages; Promissory Notes or Bonds of individuals; Judgments; Public Loans or Bonds (not exempted); Bonds, Notes, etc., issued by Corporations (not exempted); Bonds, etc. of Corporations of First Class; Shares of Stock, etc.; Articles of Agreement, Mortgages, Judgment Notes or Promissory Notes between members of the family are taxable.

If there is any doubt as to the taxability of securities held, consult your lawyer, banker or broker. Assistance in preparing forms is available at the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

## YOUR LEGISLATOR'S REPORT

This week the Supreme Court handed down its decision on legislative reapportionment. This has been a very knotty and complex problem and I'm glad to have it now settled. Both parties worked out a bi-partisan plan for Lancaster County and by this plan has been followed. We had hoped that it would be necessary to part of the county in with Lebanon County, not because of any antagonism toward our neighbor, but because our population fit very neatly into the guideline for a five district county. However, as in so many things in politics, the local situation had to give a bit in order to work out a state-wide plan. As a result, Elizabeth & Warwick Townships and the borough of Lititz are included in a district with part of Lebanon County.

Lebanon County was the main problem in reapportioning this part of Pennsylvania. Its population is too large for only one district and not large enough for two. The only solution was to create one seat which includes the major portion of Lebanon County and another seat for the remaining portion of Lebanon County and another seat for the remaining portion of Lebanon County and part of an adjoining county. Lebanon and Lancaster Counties have many things in common and a joinder of parts of these two counties into a district makes a certain amount of sense. It shouldn't be difficult for one man to adequately represent the interests of both counties since they have so much in common. Given their ideal choice I believe both counties would prefer to have all their districts completely within their individual boundary lines, however this has turned out to be impossible under the guidelines agreed upon, and with this in mind the final plan is one we can all live with.

As far as Lancaster County is concerned, the major

change brought about by the new plan is the division of the county into five separate districts. Up until now the county was divided into two districts, one included the City of Lancaster and the other the county. This meant that all four of the county legislators ran at large and represented the entire county exclusive of the city. Under the new plan each one of us now runs from a separate district within the county. My district is No. 98 and includes the Boroughs of Columbia, Mountville, Marietta, Mount Joy, Elizabethtown, Manheim and all the townships in between. I frankly like new method. Each one of us is most familiar with the area in which he lives and I believe each district should get better representation with one man exclusively responsible for a separate area. I certainly know more about the problems of the northwestern end of the county that I do of the other areas and I'm sure the same is true of the other legislators in regards the areas in which they live.
