 pon form, shall be registrable as to principal only, shall bear interest at the rates per annum, payable semiannually, except the first interest payment, which shall be on November 1, 1966 for a period of 8 months, on the first days of May and November of each year, until maturity or redemption of the bonds; shall mature, and shall be payable, principal and interest, at the principal office of the Trustee in Mount Joy, Pa., shall be redeemable prior to maturity and in the manner as provided in the bonds, and as all provided in the form of Supplemental Indenture as submitted to this meeting.

Section 6. The 1966 Series Bonds shall be equally and ratably secured, together with all outstanding Water Revenue Bonds — Series of 1954, by the Original Indenture and Supplemental Indenture, under the terms of which Indentures the annual revenues to be received by the Authority from, or in

connection with, the operation of the Water System are pledged, to the extent set forth therein, for the payment of the principal of, and interest on, all bonds issued thereunder. The 1966 Series Bonds shall not in any manner pledge the credit or taxing power of the Borough or of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or of any political subdivision thereof, nor shall the Borough or the Commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof be liable for the payment of the principal of, or the interest on, any such Bonds, but they shall be secured upon and payable from the revenues of the Authority derived from the operation of the Water System (including the aforesaid Capital Additions) and from such other moneys as may be made available for that purpose.

Section 7. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Board of the Authority is hereby authorized to sign on behalf of the Authority and to affix thereto the corporate seal of the Authority, duly attested by the Secretary of the Board, the aforesaid \$500,000 principal amount of 1966 Series Bonds and to cause the coupons attached

to the bonds to be authenticated by the facsimile signature of the Treasurer of the Authority. The said officers are also authorized to execute any temporary bond or bonds as provided for under the terms of the Indentures and to exchange such temporary bond or bonds for definitive bond or bonds when prepared and executed. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Authority is further authorized to deliver the 1966 Series Bonds to Union National Mount Joy Bank, as Trustee under the Original Indenture and Supplemental Indenture for authentication and delivery and the Bank is hereby requested to authenticate and deliver the principal amount of Bonds to, or upon the order of, the Chairman of the Authority, all in accordance with the provisions of the Indentures.

Section 8. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Authority is hereby authorized and directed to deliver all of the 1966 Series Bonds, which have been awarded to C. C. Collings and Company, Inc., Philadelphia, Pa., as the purchaser thereof, to said purchaser, upon payment by said purchaser of the full balance of the purchase price

therefor and accrued interest. Section 9. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Authority is hereby authorized and directed, concurrently with receipt of the proceeds of the sale of the 1966 Series Bonds, in this Resolution authorized to be issued, to forthwith deposit the same, in a Special Account with the Banking Department of the Trustee Bank. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman and the Treasurer or Secretary of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to draw checks against said Special Account and disburse the same to pay the items and amounts or make the transfers and deposits all as set forth in an Authority Officers Certificate relating thereto to be delivered to the Trustee by the Authority at the time of the settlement for the Bonds herein authorized.

Section 10. The Chairman or Vice Chairman of the Board, the Secretary and the Treasurer are hereby authorized and empowered on behalf of the Authority to execute any and all papers and documents and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for the execution or carrying out of this Resolution, of the Supplemental Indenture and in the issuance and delivery of the \$500,000 principal amount of Water Revenue Bonds — Series of 1966, of Authority.

Section 11. All resolutions or parts of resolutions inconsistent herewith be and the same hereby are rescinded, cancelled and annulled.
