The bride, a 1964 graduate of Donegal high school, attended Elizabethtown college for a year and is employed by the Penna. Highway Dept.

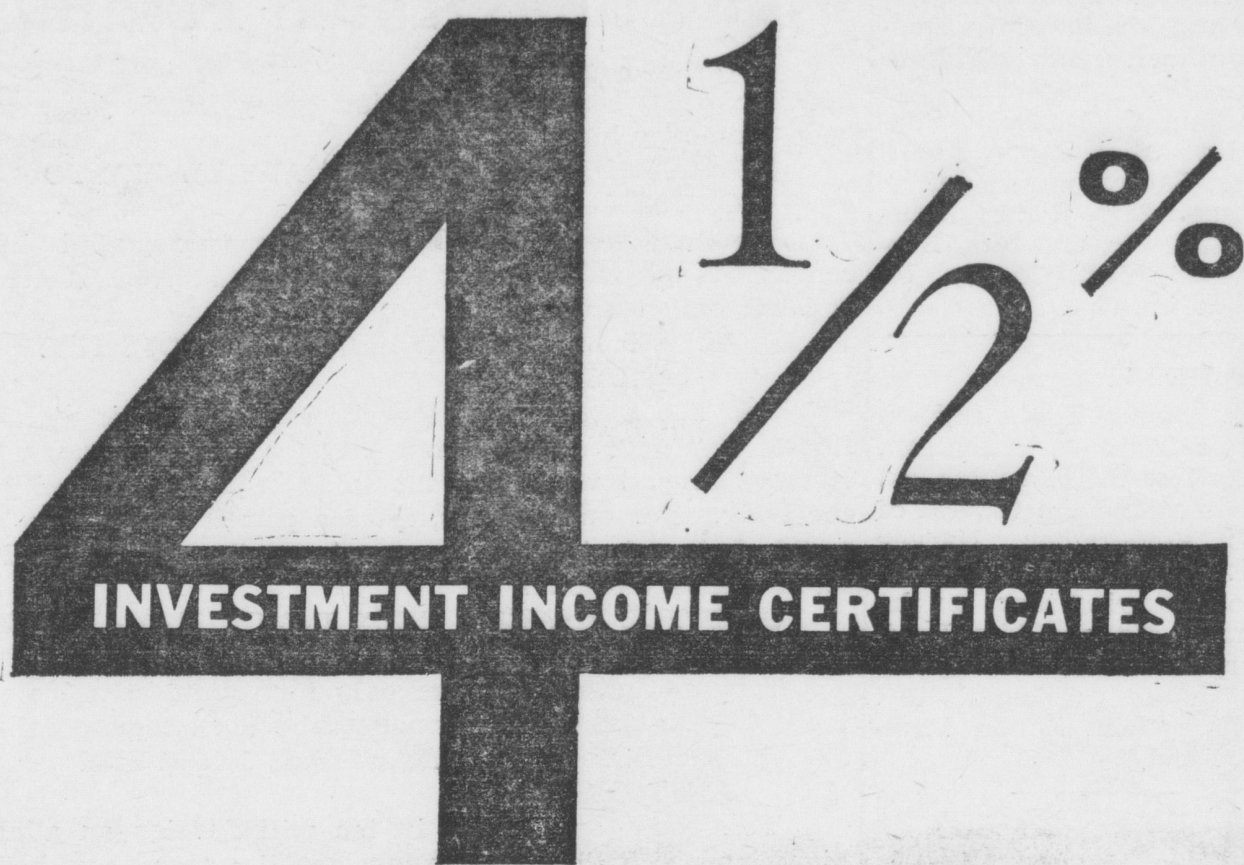

The couple will reside at Gutshall's Trailer Court, in Marietta R1.

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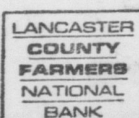

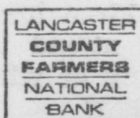
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To Assist Youths In Finding Jobs
