EASTER EGG HUNT

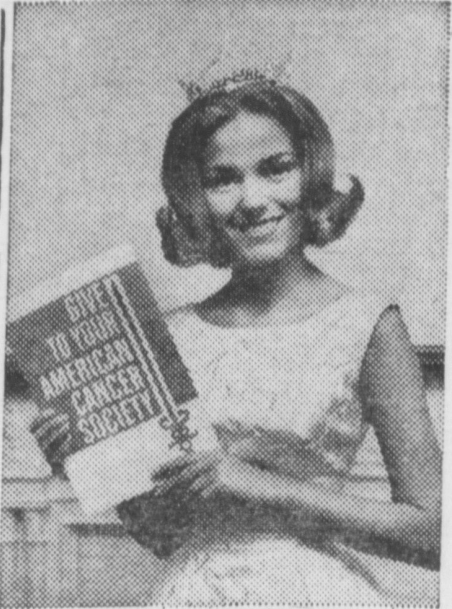
