This tourney must be organized by the time the first association tournament is held on Sunday, May 22 at Cool Creek so that each golfer can see whom he is scheduled to play.

The association tournament on May 22 will have Roy Packer as defending champion in the low actual score-

division as he posted an 80 last year as did William Baughman, Frank Aument and Gerald Hostetter. However, in cases of tie, the scores on each hole, beginning with the first, are used to break the tie. In this case, Roy had pars on the first and second holes. In the handicap division there also was a four-way tie at 70 with William Baughman winning on the basis of a par on the first hole over Irvin Hostetter, Elias Lindemuth and Gerald Sheetz.

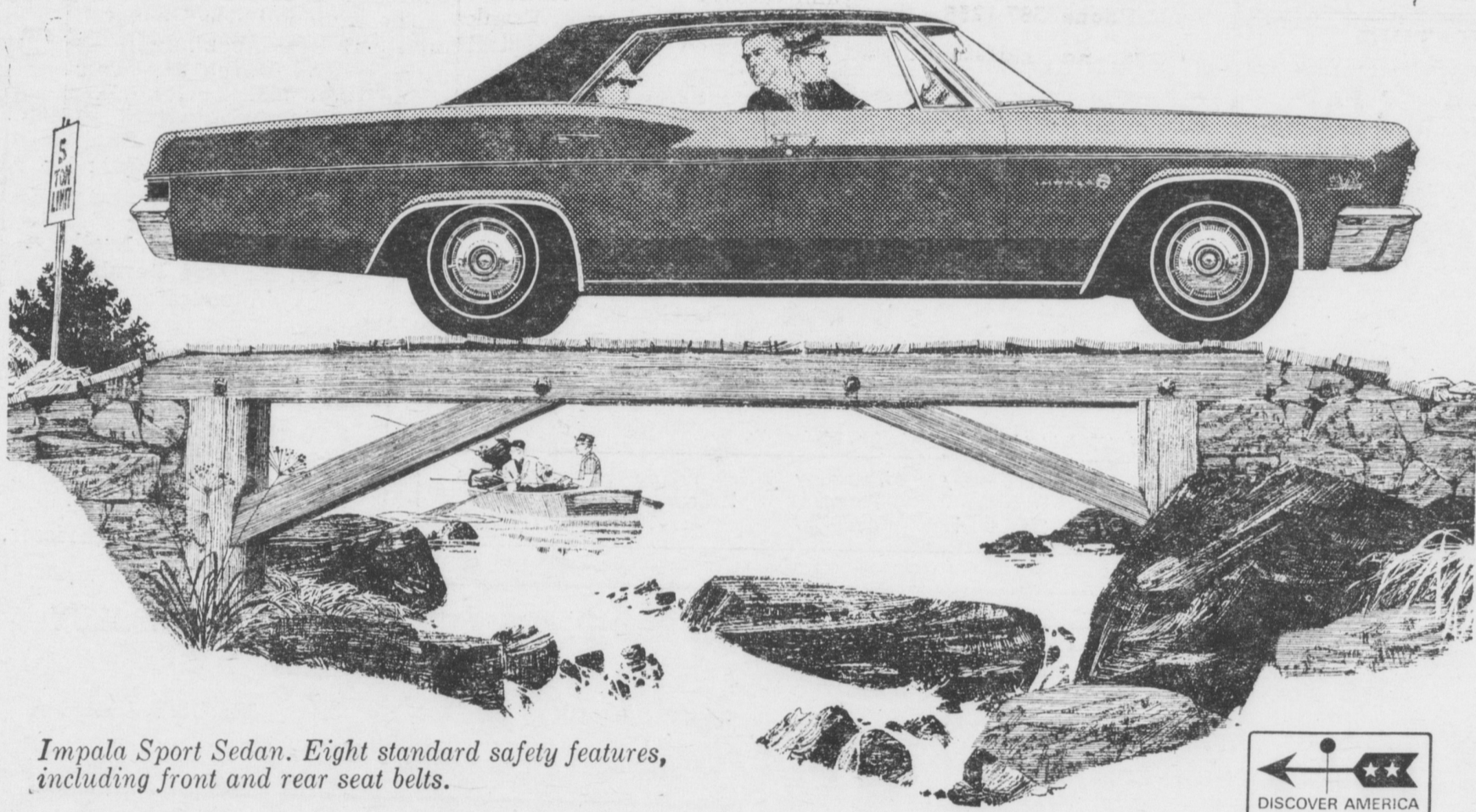
Rotarians See ZIP Code Movie

"Straight Line," the story of ZIP Code in movies, was shown for Mount Joy Rotarians Tuesday as the clubmen held their weekly luncheon meeting at Hostetters.

The film pointed out the reasons, mechanics and advantages of use of the U. S. Postal Department's new ZIP code numbers and urged all mailers — large and small — to add the important number to all addresses.

The movie explained that the five-digit number represents three keys for fast postal service. The first number indicates a big section (one of ten in the U. S. The second and third indicate the center within the center and the last two the actual post office to which the mail is addressed.
