

"Not for me" ... says former Beauty Queen.



With the entire State embarking on a Bicycle Safety Week campaign, Mrs. Rosemary Diamond, secretary at the Franklin Institute, 20th & Parkway, Philadelphia, takes a skeptical view of riding an 1888 "Victor Racer." Since the days of the "high wheeler" shown here, bicycle safety has assumed a more serious role in the Commonwealth.

Governor Scranton in a proclamation has appealed to all Pennsylvanians to teach their children the need for safety while riding in an effort to curb the rising toll of highway deaths resulting from bicycle accidents. Last year 44 persons died on Pennsylvania highways as a result of cycling accidents as compared to 23 deaths in 1964. The week of April 25 has been designated as "Bicycle Safety Week" by the Governor.

Checks For Kids' Bikes

Every father owes it to his child to make personally an "eight-point" inspection of his off-spring's bicycle before he takes to the road this Spring, according to Commissioner Harry H. Brainerd of the Pennsylvania Bureau of Traffic Safety.

"While the Commonwealth requires that all automobiles be inspected before they are driven on the highways, no such law exists for bicycles. It is, nevertheless, an important safety factor to be sure that all bikes are in proper operating conditions," he said.

Following are eight "check-points" to assure a bicycle is in safe operating condition:

1. Check brakes to be sure they grip quickly, firmly and evenly.
2. Inspect the tires looking for bubbles or worn spots that indicate dangerously

thin tread.

3. Look for broken spokes that would cause the wheels to wobble.
4. Inspect the balance of the wheel to be sure it is turning true.

5. Check the handlebars and other steering mechanisms making sure they operate safely.

6. Check the bicycle chain to be sure it is not too loose and does not have any broken links.
7. Inspect the front light and rear reflectors or tail light. They should be visible for at least 500 feet.

8. Check the seat adjustment to make sure it is fastened tightly and also that it is properly adjusted to fit the rider.

The week of April 25 has been proclaimed Bicycle Safety Week by Governor William W. Scranton.

post, provided 14 years ago under a law favoring REA, the NAPUS report indicated.

Because of lost volume in first class offices — which today serve 140 million Americans — parcel post rates (or taxes) for everyone have been raised about \$500 million since 1951. Overall increases in parcel rates have totaled about 130 per cent.

Some post offices more than 150 miles away from Mount Joy which are now affected by the limitation here include: Dayton, Ohio; Cincinnati, Ohio & Louisville, Ky.

The parcel post reform legislation would go a long way toward correcting parcel mailing problems and reducing expenses, the Postmaster noted.

For parcels going less than 150 miles, the present 40-lb. limit would be retained, but a new size liberalization to 100 inches from the present 72 inch limit would be beneficial for these parcels, the Postmaster explained.
