Janine Atkinson is president of Hempfield Chapter. Miss Mae Shenk is faculty sponsor.

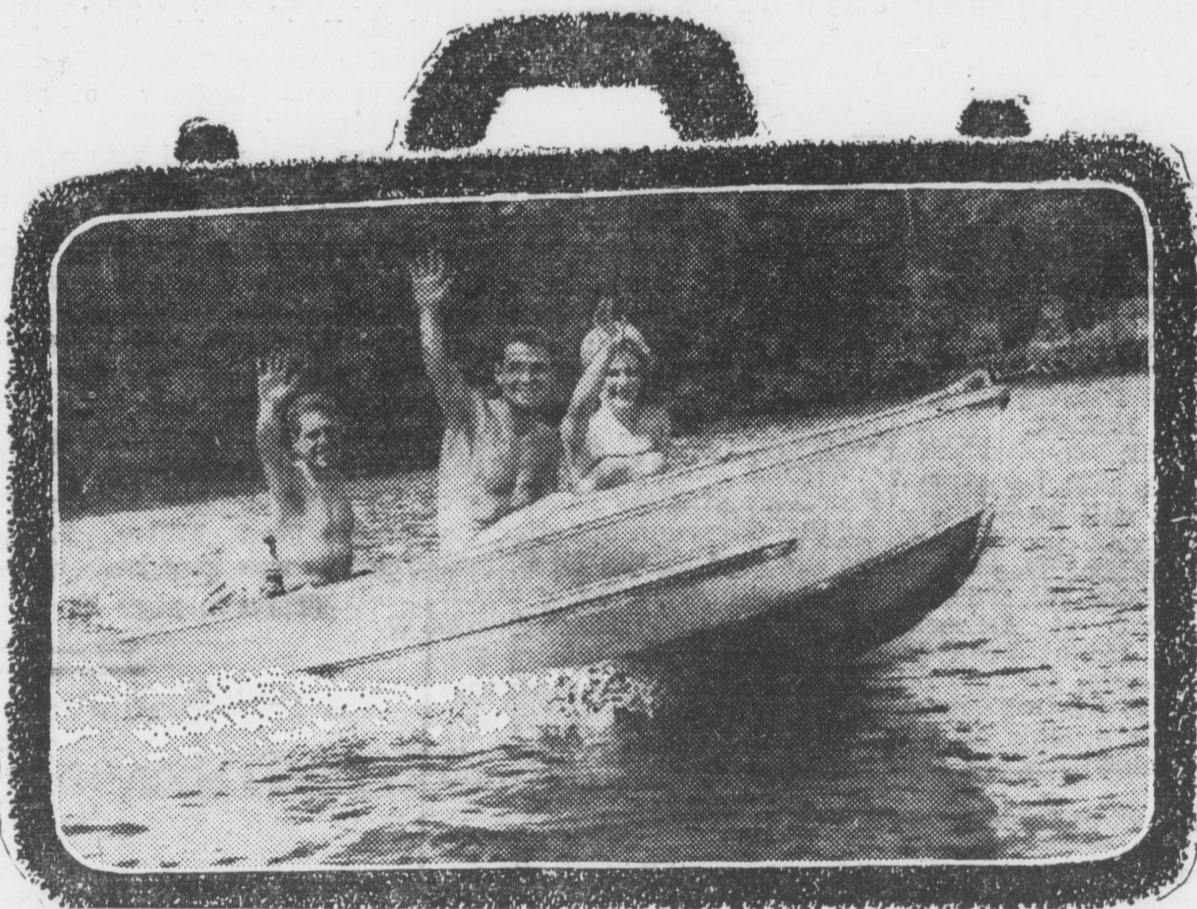
