## Propose School Tax Hike

The budget and the band were two priority items at the May meeting of the Donegal School Board, held on Thursday, May 19, in the D. H. S. library.

Fiscal considerations included the tentative adoption of a yearly budget which calls for expenditures of \$1,892,300.

To meet the local responsibility for that figure, the board sees a 52 mill real estate tax, an increase of five mills above this year's levy. In addition, the tax structure calls for a \$10 head tax and a 3/4% wage tax, both the same as at present.

Principal item leading to the increase in teachers' salaries.

Final passage of the budget and levy of the taxes will come later. However, emphasizing the intent of the board was a decision to proceed with the printing of tax forms, thereby expediting the machinery of tax collections.

Musical considerations resulted in the hiring of a new band director and the buying of new band uniforms for Donegal high school.

A contract was let to a New York firm to furnish complete uniforms at a cost of approximately \$7,500. A sample uniform, to Donegal specifications will be made and submitted for final approval before the order is actually placed. Eighty uniforms are to be bought.

Glenn N. Leib of Dover, Pa., was employed as teacher of instrumental music and di-

rector of the band, grades 7 to 12.

He is a graduate of West Chester College and will be completing his masters' work this summer. For the past two years he has taught in the Eddystone high school and directed the band.

Other business:

—It was reported that a summer reading program will be operated this year for pupils who are reading one year or lower below grade level. The six-weeks course will run from July until Aug. 15.

—Plans are being considered for improving the driveway and parking situation at Seiler school.

—Two new members of the board are to be named prior to July 1, 1966.

—Nine teaching vacancies for next school year now exist.

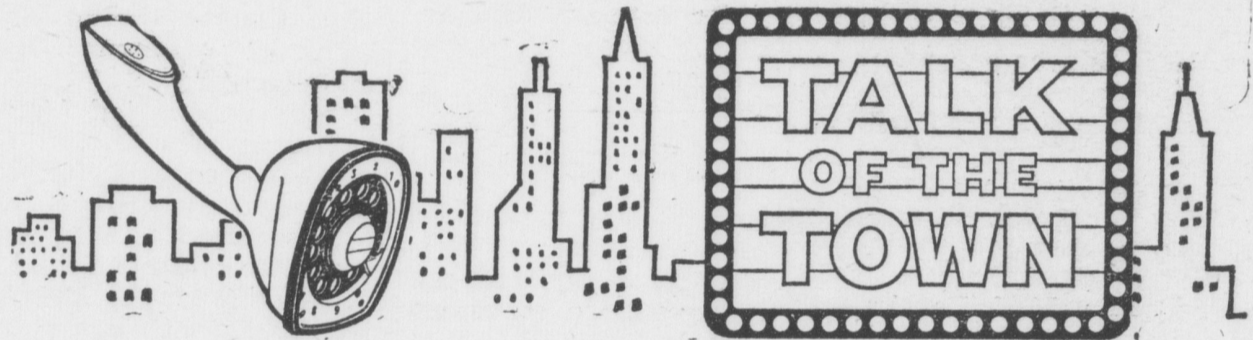

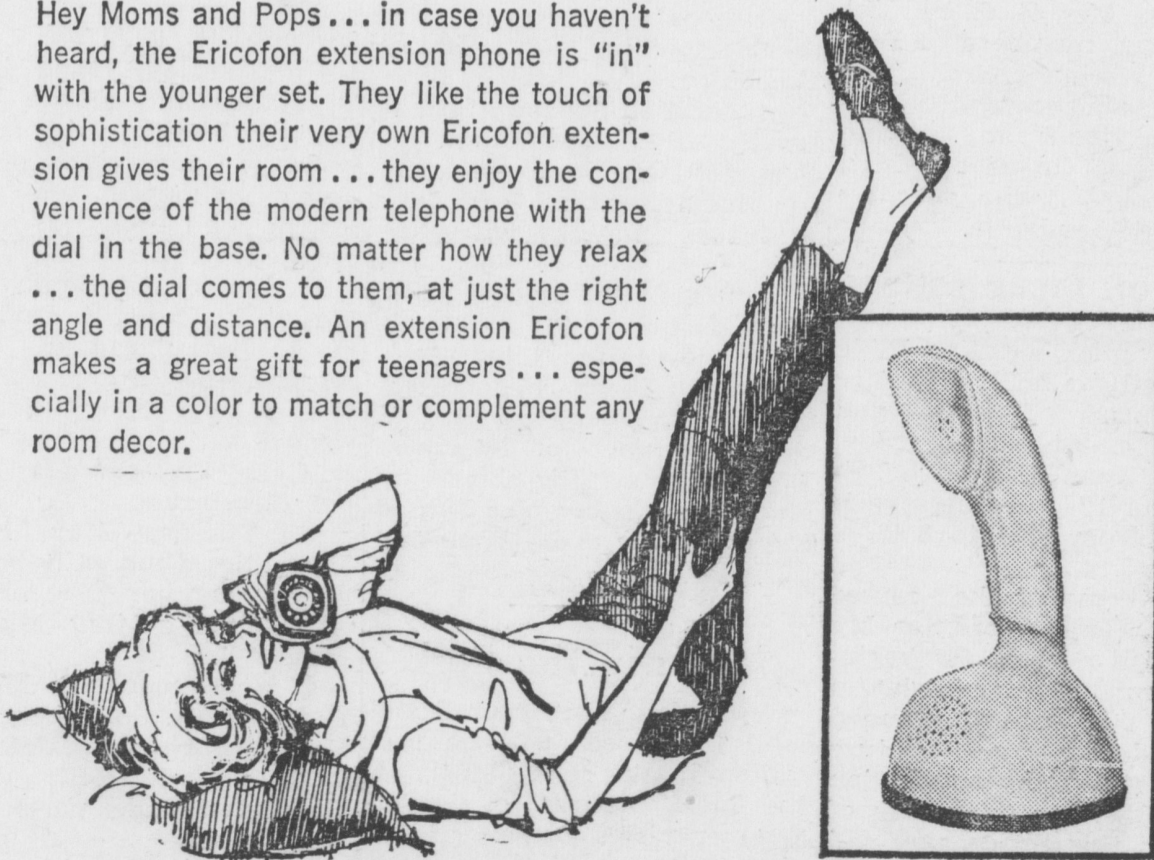
