The new program, according to S. F. Diffenderfer, PP& L's Lancaster division vicepresident, is titled: "U.S. Products for Export Catalog

Files"

He explained that through the catalog services of the World Trade Information Center. Inc., and follow-up service by the Export Marketing Service of the American Express Company, systematic circulation of product information will be assured.

"Every working day," said Diffenderfer, "American foreign service posts around the world receive 9,000 inquiries about products made by U. S.

manufacturers."

The program will work like this: product literature or catalog of the subscribing company is bound in the U.S. Products for Export Catalog Files for appropriate product category. The files are then distributed to U.S. foreign service offices in quantities recommended by the American commercial officer in each area.

The files also go to offices of American Express, cooperating airlines, shipping companies, trade centers, trade fairs and trade associations and other groups interested in promoting U.S. trade overseas.

Diffenderfer emphasized the value of world-wide distribution of product information through the progdam at low cost in comparison with other methods. The subscription rate is the only cost charged a company to include its literature in the files. Two pages, for example - a single sheet printed on both sidesmay be included for \$80.
