An Editorion

Last week Mount Joy Borough Council received a complete report on the activities of its building committee.

A long and more exhaustive study than might have been anticipated, the report, in essence, said that the committee feels the borough should build a combination garage for its several vehicles and fire house for the Florin Fire company.

The committee went deep into the project to have preliminary drawings made of the building it has in mind and had estimates made by reputable suppliers and contractors.

The cost, apparently would be considerably in excess of \$60,000 — perhaps 10 or 15 percent or even more.

Almost immediately after the report was made opposition to the plan appeared under the surface and within a few days the ideas put forth on Monday (the 3rd) were under fire.
