GIVEN AWARD

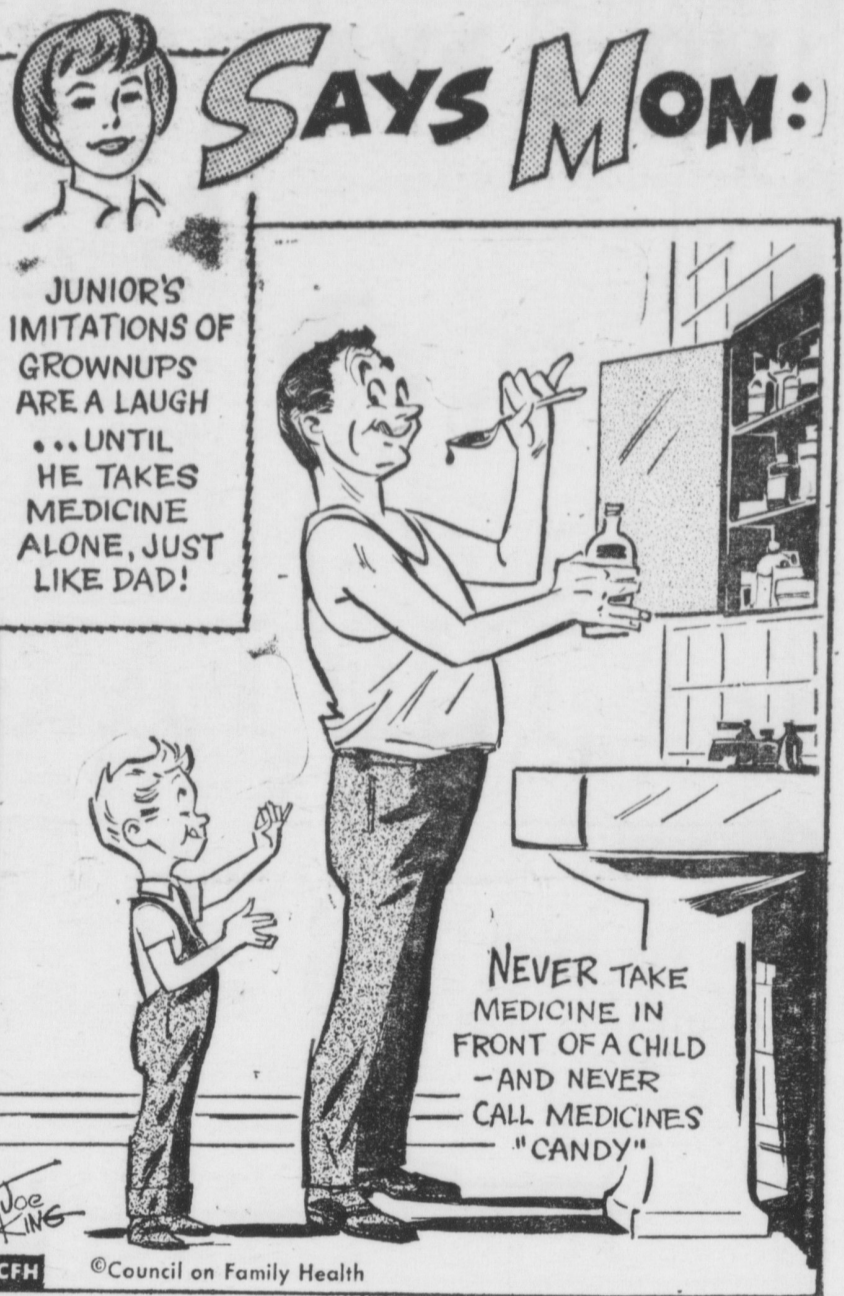
