Made Base Administrator

Air Force Captain Karl J. Max has been made Administrative Officer for Deputy Commander (support) of Field Command, DASA, Sandia Base, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Before assuming the Administrative post for Field Command's Deputy Commander, Captain Max served as Administrative Officer for the Base Support Group of Field Command. He was assigned to Sandia in July 1965 from a tour as Chief Interceptor Controller with the 86th Air Division (Defense) in Germany.

A veteran of more than 18 years of military service the captain enlisted as an Army Private in August 1948 and received a promotion to Master Sergeant in October 1955. A year later he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant after completing the Air Force Officers' Candidate

School and received his regular Air Force Commission in May 1960.

The native of Mount Joy, he is the son of Mrs. Mary F. Max, 120 Lumber St., and a 1948 graduate of Mount Joy High School. He attended Florida State University and was graduated from the Air Force Weapons Controller School in 1962. In addition to his tour in Germany, he has served in Korea and various stateside assignments. He holds the Army and Air Force Commendation Medals, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award with one Oak Leaf Cluster, and Korean Presidential Citation.

Captain Max is married to the former Mary Jane Prewitt, daughter of Mrs. Arch P. Prewitt, 265 S. Highland, Winchester, Kentucky. They reside at 3302 43rd Place, Sandia Base, and have three children: Naniye Jane, 9; Kathryn Ann 5; and Kraig, 6 months.
