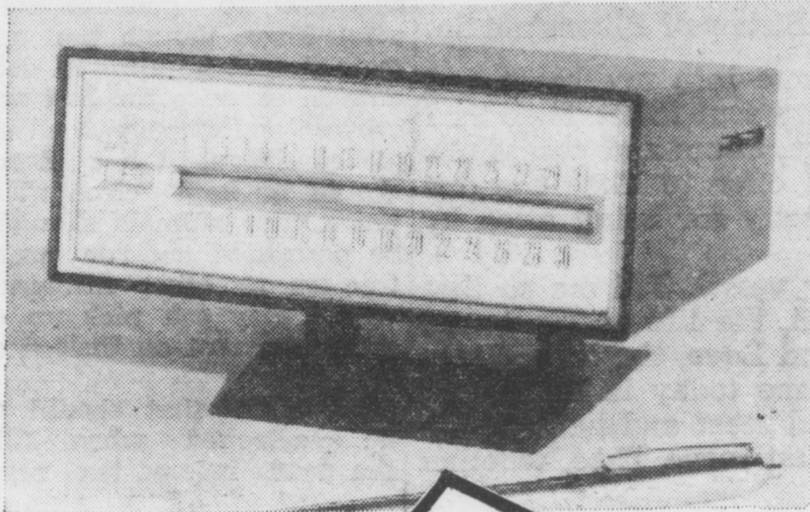
Members who attend the Christmas party are asked to bring a 50c gift for the exchange of gifts with others.

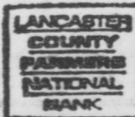
