United Utilities To Up Dividends

An increase in the quarterly dividend and a proposal to authorize the issuance of 10 million shares of preferred stock has received approval of the Board of Directors of United Utilities, Inc.

The board, meeting at the company headquarters in Kansas City, voted to increase the first quarterly dividend of 1967 to 20 cents a share, up from 19 cents, to shareholders of record on March 28.

The indicated annual dividend rate of 80 cents a share is up four cents a share from 1966.

A resolution to amend the articles of incorporation and authorize the issuance of 10 million shares of preferred stock, with specific terms to be stipulated by the directors, was passed. The proposal is subject to approval by stockholders at the company's annual meeting May 25. The record date entitling stockholders to notice of and to vote at the annual meeting was set as April 17, 1967.

"This form of security is being recommended to our shareholders to provide additional flexibility in our acquisition program and in financing our record construction program," P. H. Henson, president and board chairman


The above nominees were chosen by senior homerooms. The entire student body chose the winner of the contest by depositing penny votes in jars decorated for
