In considering the possibility of using the Lancaster landfill, council noted that the extra distance and added time would add an estimated \$3,000 to present costs, it was feared, would add so greatly to the total time necessary for the job that it might be impossible to make weekly collections throughout the borough.

Considering the possibilities for garbage and trash removal on a long-term basis, council heard such suggestions as: 1. develop their own landfill operation; 2. Form a cooperative landfill with municipalities in the area; 3. Construct a cooperative incinerator; 4. Private garbage disposals in all homes. 5. A public disposal which discharges pulverized garbage into the public sewer system.

Borough council members are well aware of the complexity of the problem they now face and in all probability a special council meeting will be held within the very near future in an effort to hammer out a solution.

Garbage and trash disposal in a community of some 1600 homes is a constant and continuing activity. The 5000 population generates huge quantities of refuse which must, for health and sanitation reasons, be removed on a regular basis.

Mount Joy boough crew people have been removing nearly 40 loads of refuse per month, hauling to the Elizabethtown landfill. It has been costing the borough about \$3.50 per load to dump on the private landfill.

And, in visualizing the quantity of refuse involved, consider that the new borough compactor truck, squeezes and compresses its loads, using the specially built hydraulic equipment which is part of the truck itself. Each load from this equipment would equal several ordinary truck-loads of garbage and trash.
