In connection with a continuing recruiting program, a written examination for State Police Cadet applicants is scheduled for May 6 and applications from those interested in participating in this examination must be received prior to Friday, April 21, 1967.

Basic requirements for State Police trooper positions are: 21 to 30 years of age; 5'8" to 6'4"; 145 to 210 lbs.; 20/30 uncorrected vision

each eye; high school graduate, and Pennsylvania Resident.

Benefits include: Trooper salary - \$6,390 to \$8,580 per annum; Early retirement; Partially-paid hospitalization; 15 days annual vacation, and 15 days annual sick leave.

## PP&L Employees Win Certificates

Fourteen employee groups of Pennsylvania Power and Light Company have been named winners of the 1966 Merit Award for Safety Certificate, it has been announced by Jack K. Busby, PP&L president.

The PP&L winners in the Lancaster area are: Division Operations and System Operating departments, Holtwood hydroelectric and steam-electric plants and the utility's Manor coal plant. The representative groups working at these locations receive the Safety certificates in recognition for compiling no-lost-time safety records during 1966.

In announcing the winners, Busby said, "The Safety Merit Awards program aims to acknowledge good safety performance by departments. This helps stimulate interest, create a competitive attitude among employees for improvement and in turn build awareness to safe work practices."

"Better service," he said, "is directly associated with the Company's safety effort - fewer employees out of work from injury means increased efficiency in operating the business. This, of course, is partly reflected in improved customer service."

PP&L inaugurated the Merit Award program in 1965. The 14 group winners include 1778 employees working 3,520,440 man-hours without a lost-time accident.
