AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO OPEN ORCHARD ROAD IN THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY LANCASTER COUNTY, PA. AS FOLLOWS:

Whereas Orchard Road is now a public street of the Borough of Mount Joy of a width of 33 feet, and extends from the northern side of the Harrisburg Pike (Legislative Route 129, Penna. State Route 230) northwardly to the northern boundary line of the Borough. By various acts of dedication, the owners of all of the property abutting on the said Orchard Road, 33 feet wide, have from time to time dedicated for use of the street, additional lands aggregating, with said existing 33 feet wide right-of-way 66 feet in width, but neither the Borough nor the Township of which the street was formerly a part, has accepted or opened the additional width, or any part thereof.

And whereas all of the owners of all of the properties abutting on said Orchard Road have petitioned the Borough Council to accept and open said Orchard Road to a width of 50 feet, in accordance with the survey thereof prepared by H. F. Huth Engineers, Inc., Lancaster, Pa. and designated by said engineers as "Plain and Profile of Orchard Road — Borough of Mount Joy," dated April 14, 1967, Drawing No. MJ 37.

By said petition, the said abutting owners have released the Borough from all claims for damages of any kind, arising out of the acceptance and opening of the said street to a width of 50 feet, and from the grading, draining, or other improvement of the said street in accordance with the lines and grades of the said survey.

And Whereas the Borough Planning Commission has approved the said petition and the acceptance and opening of the said street as requested.

Therefore:
Sec. 1. The Borough of Mount Joy hereby ordains, lays out, and directs the opening of Orchard Road to a width of 50 feet from its southern terminus at the Harrisburg Pike (Pa. Legislative Route #129, Pa. State Route 230) to the northern boundary line of the Borough, as a public street, hereby accepting the previous dedicated lands necessary for the widening of said street from its present established widths of 33 feet to a hereby ordained width of 50 feet. The location of the said street as hereby laid out and to be opened shall be in accordance with the survey of H. F. Huth Engineers, Inc. recited in the preamble, of this Ordinance.

Sec. 2. The Borough officers are directed to do all things necessary to complete the establishment of the said street as a public street to the said width of 50 feet.

Ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, July 3, 1967.
