ond runner-up.

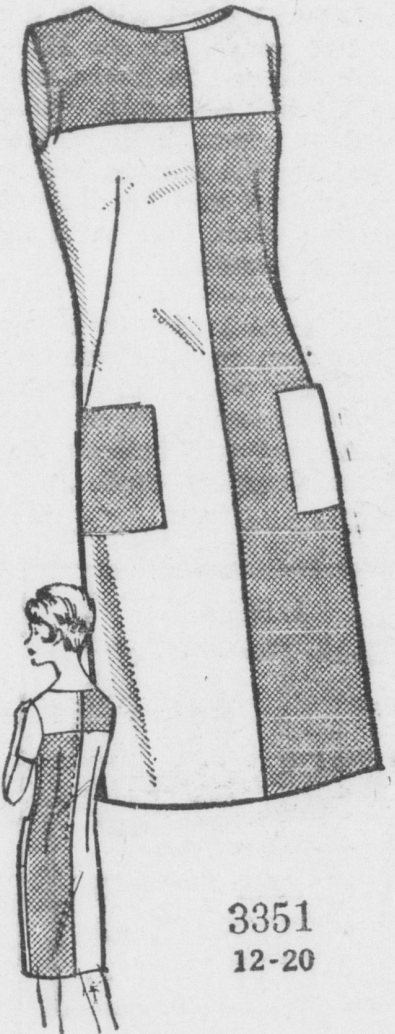
