AMP Sales Up; Net Income Dips

Combined sales of AMP Incorporated, subsidiaries and Pamcor, Inc. (an affiliate) for the six months to June 30, 1967, amounted to \$75,200,000 or 9% ahead of the \$68,700,000 reported for the first half of 1966.

Combined net income for the first half this year amounted to \$7,020,000, equal to 58c per Endorsed Share on the 12,202,866 shares outstanding as of June 30, 1967. This was a decline of 4 percent from net income of \$7,340,000 or 60c per Endorsed Share, based on 12,178,112 shares in the first half last year. The 1966 per share figures are adjusted to reflect a 2 for 1 stock split May, '67 U. A. Whitaker, Chairman of the Board and S. S. Auchincloss, President, told shareholders that the modest decline in six months earnings was due to a general expenditure level that is still appreciably higher than a year ago. "In making a comparison with the first half of 1966, it should be noted that the second quarter of 1966 was unusually strong. Earnings in that quarter set an all-time high when sales were rising faster than the general level of expenditures," the AMP officials stated.
