State Tests Water Samples

Tuesday, Sept. 5, several residents of Mount Joy borough met with the Borough Authority to talk about several matters concerning the water distribution system, including pressure on Bruce avenue, open reservoir, etc.

One technical question for which there were no answers "on the spot" included results of water tests.

This week the Authority released the following letter, which concerns August 23rd and August 30th testing of water samples.

The release says,

September 8, 1967

"The Borough Authority re-

ceived a copy of a letter addressed to its Solicitor, written by their engineer.

"Dear Mr. Kershner:

"As a result of the complaint by certain residents of the Florin Ward of Mount Joy on possible contamination of the balancing reservoir, the Authority's Engineer reviewed the results of bacteriological analyses taken on August 23, 1967 and August 30, 1967, and reported as follows: "There were no coliforms present in any of the samples indicating harmful contamination and each of the tests indicated that the water was safe for drinking purposes".

"Tests were taken at the following locations.

- (1) Washington Elementary School - Florin - Fountain
- (2) Roy Wagner - Florin, R. D. 1 - Tap
- (3) High School - Mount Joy - Fountain
- (4) Elementary School - Mount Joy - Fountain
- (5) Farmer's Co-op - Mount Joy - Tap
- (6) Church of Brethren - Florin - Outside tap.

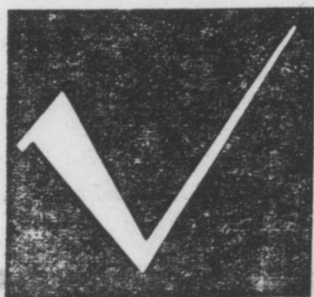
