JOY BOROUGH AUTHORITY, 81 E. MAIN STREET, MOUNT JOY, PA. until 8:00 P.M. - October 3,

1967, at which time they will be publicly opened and read. At a regular Borough Authority meeting in the Mount Joy Fire Hall.

The Proposal must cover all labor, equipment, materials and all other costs incidental to the work. The right is reserved to reject any or all Proposals and to re-advertise and award the Contract in the regular manner, or to waive any informality in the Proposals received and to accept any Proposal deemed to be most favorable to the interests of the Mt. Joy Borough Authority.

Bids will be taken under advisement and the award of a Contract, if awarded, will be made within sixty (60) days after the date of opening the bids.

Each Proposal must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond in an amount not less than ten (10) per cent of the bid total, payable to Mt. The successful awarded will be returned to execute a contract and furnish bonds and insurance within ten (10) days from the date the notice of award is delivered or mailed to him. Upon approval of the bonds and insurance and execution of the Contract the deposit of the successful bid-

der will be returned. The amount of security required for the faithful performance of the work will be one hundred (100) per cent of the estimated cost of the work according to the contract price.
