## PP&L Posts Scholarships

Pennsylvania Power and Light company has announced a program of scholarship grants at 21 colleges and universities within its service area to begin at the start of the 1968 academic year. The program reflects the company's conviction that higher education helps capable young people better realize and develop their potential which in turn advances our country's progress.

Four scholarship grants will be made annually at each of the 21 institutions, each valued at \$300 at private colleges and universities and \$250 at state colleges. Besides the four unrestricted scholarship grants, four additional grants will be offered at Bucknell and Lehigh universities and \$250 at state colleges. For study in either electrical engineering or mechanical engineering.

Any student — freshman, sophomore, junior or senior — residing in the PP&L 29-

county service area is eligible to apply for a scholarship grant. Persons living in municipalities in the service area served indirectly by the company through resale distribution will also be eligible to apply for a grant.

College or university authorities have sole responsibility for selecting winners of PP&L Scholarship Grants from among eligible applicants. Financial need will be considered in addition to scholastic ability and any other criteria customarily examined in awarding a scholarship.
