Purchase of approximately 10 acres of land adjacent to the Landisville swimming pool has been approved by the Hempfield Youth Assn. as a start of a long range program to build a recreation park. Ken Carpenter, Jr. of 3069 Essex Place, said the park will be designed primarily for use of the area's youth and will include three baseball fields, a picnic area, children's recreation facilities, pavilion for group and community programs, softball field, basketball court & football field.
