"Dorothy Schock," said Newcomer, "has served her community in many ways. For years, she was a leading soprano in the city, and served churches of all faiths as a soloist, as well as directing many church choirs.

"At present she is director of the Red Rose City Chapter of Sweet Adelines, and she has been a guest conductor for the Lancaster County Schools' Music Festival. She is an honorary member of the National Federation of Music Clubs, and has been a recipient of the "Classroom of the Month" award sponsored by the National Freedoms Foundation.
