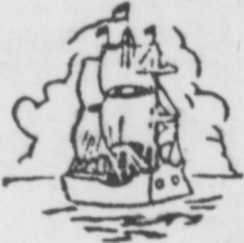

## LANDISVILLE - SALUNGA NEWS

East Hempfield Twp. Supervisors recently met and passed two ordinances amending the present zoning ordinance in the township.

One ordinance rezoned a tract of land from agricultural and commercial status to industrial status. The land is located east of Donnerville Road and the Little Conestoga Creek and is owned by Elmer and Susan Shirk. They were joined in their decision by the Industrial Development Company of Lancaster. The supervisors also approved a request for rezoning a tract of land from

residential to commercial use.

Part of the land, along the Marietta pike near Rohrer's town is already zoned commercial but an additional 285 feet was being sought by Kenneth C. Sahn, a real estate salesman who wants to place an office on the property.

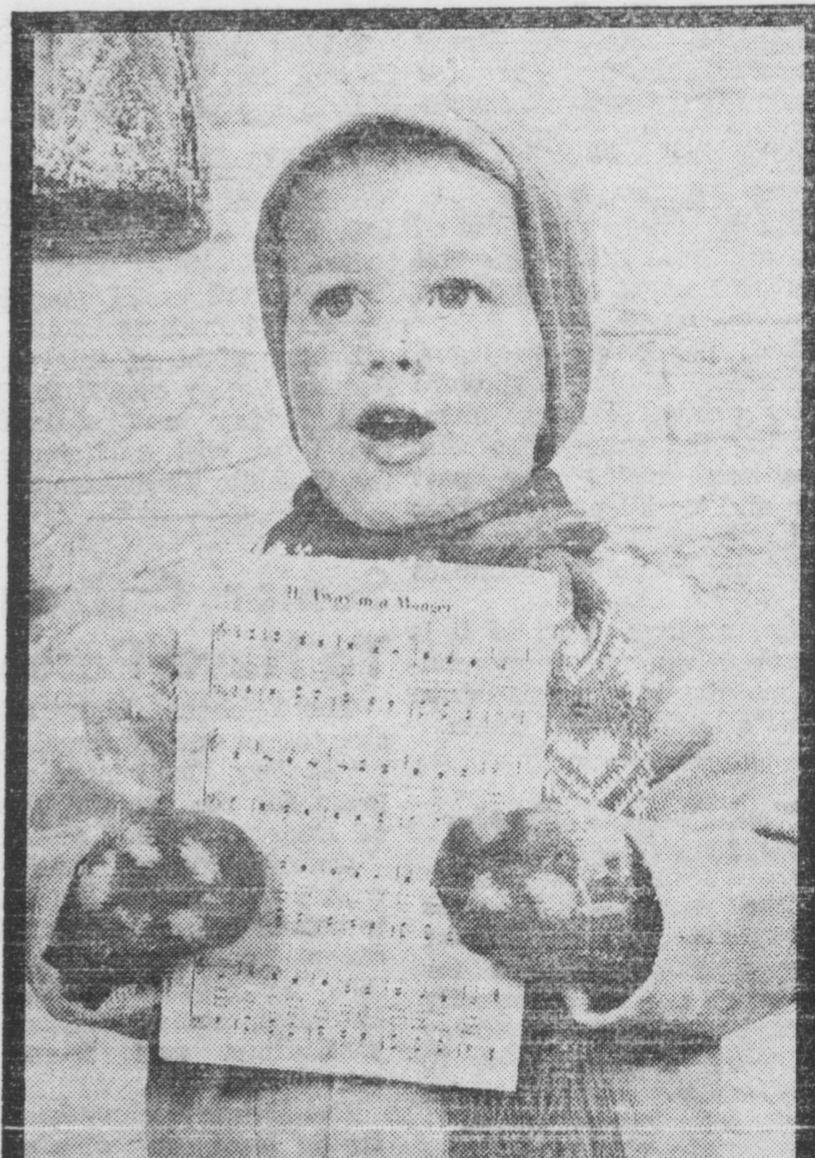
