AN ORDINANCE OF MOUNT JOY LANCASTER COUNTY gainst the same will present PENNSYLVANIA, IMPOSING them without delay for set-TAXES AND FIXING THE tlement to the undersigned, TAX RATE FOR THE RIS-CAL YEAR 1968.

> IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY LANCASTER COUNTY, PA. AS FOLLOWS:

> SECTION 1. A tax is hereby levied on all property within the said Borough subject to taxation for Borough purposes for the fiscal year 1968 as follows

Tax rate for general purposes, the sum of twelve (12) mills on each dollar assessed poses under this section, of twelve (12) mills.

SECTION 2. In addition-to the taxes levied by Section 1 of this ordinance, a per capita tax of \$5.00 is hereby levied on each resident of the twenty-one over Borough years of age, for the fiscal year 1968. This Section is enacted under authority of the Act of June 25, 1947 PL 1145 and its amendments.

SECTION 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencv

6 TIPS FOR SAFER WINTER DRIVING

By Professor A. H. Easton Director, Motor Vehicle Research Laboratory University of Wisconsin

I . Get the "feel" of the road by accelerating carefully to see if wheels spin; or brake gently to see if they skid. Reduce speed accordingly.

2 * Increase your following distance. It takes three to nine times as far to stop on snow and ice as on dry pavement.

3 "Pump" your brakes to slow or stop - don't jam them on. An intermittent pumping action three to five times per second keeps the wheels rolling and helps maintain steering control.

4 * Have good tires with good treads. Better yet, use snow tires which provide half again as much pulling power in snow as regular tires. Studded snow tires offer still more help on icy surfaces.

5 Always carry reinforced tire chains in the trunk of your car for use during severe snow and ice conditions. They provide four to seven times as much traction on snow or ice as regular tires.

6 * Keep your windshield and windows clear at all times. Replace streaking wiper blades gone dead from exposure to sun, wind and oily road film. Be sure that your windshield washer solution contains adequate anti-freeze.
