By Doris W. Thomas A new line of small electric appliances recently introduced promise to help overcome servicing difficult-

"Lifelong" appliances are designed for do-it-yourself repairs. Electric percolator, toaster, and a steam-spray iron are built with working components that you can lift out as units. Snap fits and easy locking mechanisms hold the components together. For example, you can lift out thermostat plus heating elements for the toaster and replace them with relative ease.

Cost of replacement parts built into components at the factory seems to be less than separate parts assembled by a serviceman. Because heating elements are part of the same component as the thermostat, chance for future trouble is also forestalled when a new component is locked into place.

Do-it-yourself repairs on small appliances may reduce both cost and frustration. When a small appliance does not operate satisfactorily, your problems are likely to begin. Almost every community lacks trained appliance servicemen with skills and necessary replacement parts to repair the variety of appliances you own.
