Church Holds Annual Meeting

The annual Parish meeting of St. Luke's Episcopal Church was held Sunday, January 28. It was preceded by a tureen supper in the Undercroft. The meeting was called to order by the Rector, the Rev. Donald Moore Whitesel who led the members in prayer. Reports were heard from various officers of the Parish.

Three Vestrymen were elected to serve for a period of three years. They are: Ralph Horne a resident of Elizabethtown, Robert Eno who resides in the Maytown area, and Benjamin Clinger, a resident of Lancaster. They succeed the retiring members Robert Brown who served the Parish as Senior Warden and treasurer, Dudley Anderson of Landisville who had been Junior Warden, and Paul Kitner also of Landisville.

The Rector who has served the Parish since July 1, '67 called for a continued cooperation on the part of all members of the local parish. He also stressed the need of more adequate facilities in order to carry on a more effective parish program. The facilities are very limited for this growing and progressive congregation in the

community. Members of the congregation voted unanimously to request the vestry to proceed immediately with plans for a Parish House for educational facilities, the renovating of the present Undercroft and the redecorating of the church. Dr. David E. Schlosser consented to chair this program. A full committee will be announced later. The rector also announced the need of an organized Altar Guild.

The members of the Parish were reminded that there would be no 8 a.m. celebration of the Holy Communion service during Feb. Instead, the Communion service will be held each evening during that month at 7 p.m. This is necessary because of the Rector's affiliation with the Masonic Homes where he serves as Chaplain during February and August.
