Brimming "Mugmates" and Peanut Brownies kick off the course of refreshment for the school term. With some paint and imagination teenagers can make colorful "Mug-mates" out of plain mugs. It's a great way to spark up the after-school coffee party.

For the new hostess here's a lively spiced coffee: For each two large mugfuls, brew regular-strength coffee using 4 Approved Coffee Measures of coffee (equal to 8 level measuring table-spoons) and 3 measuring cups water. Pour hot coffee over 2 cinnamon sticks, 4 whole cloves and 4 allspice berries. Let stand over lowest heat for 10 to 15 minutes. Strain into mugs and serve with sugar and whipped cream if desired.
