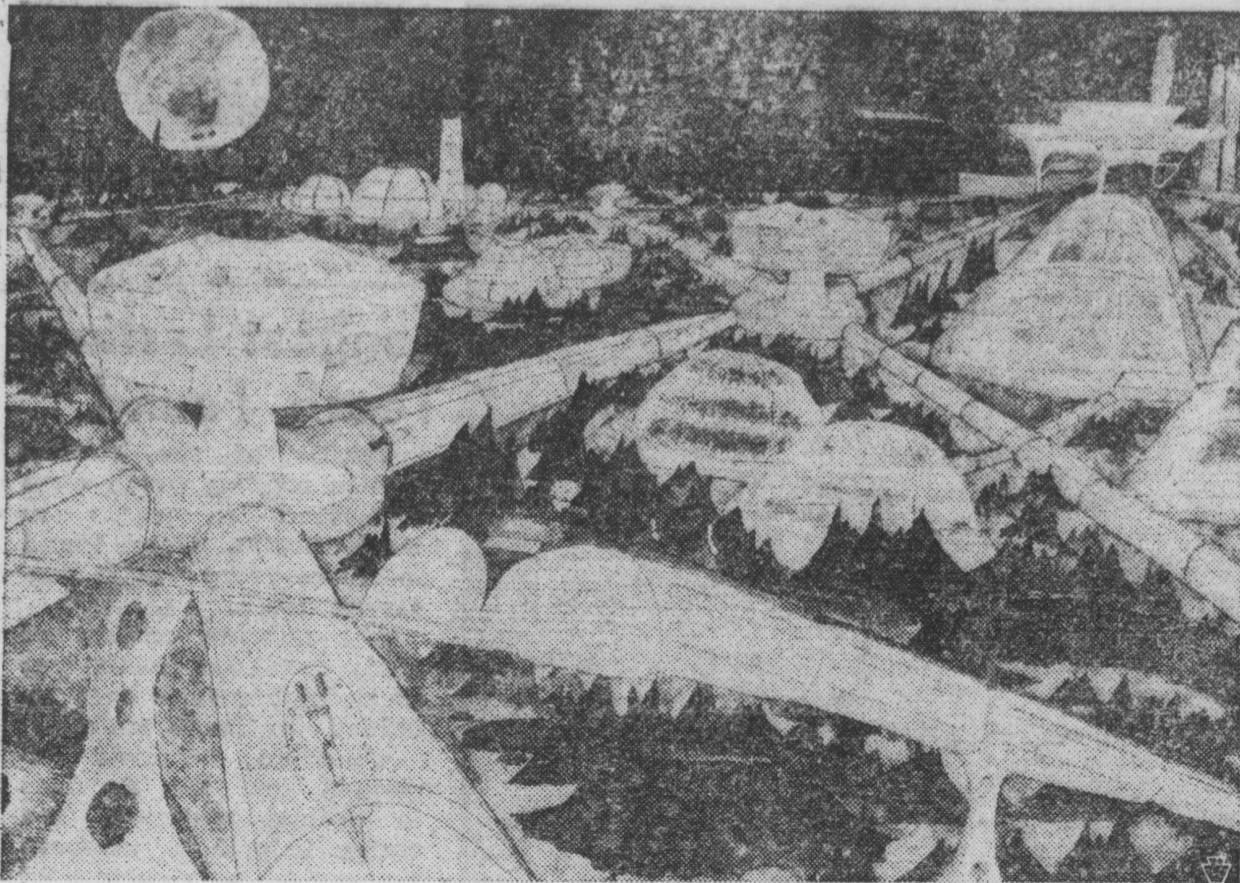


Japan In The Next Century

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY

It is hereby ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

WHEREAS, a petition has been presented to the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy by John E. Melhorn, requesting the Borough to annex to itself and make part of the Borough, certain land hereinafter described, situated in East Donegal Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, which is a second class township. And it is represented to Council by said petition that the said petitioner constitutes a majority in number of the freeholders of the said territory and it has been certified by the petitioner that a copy of the petition was duly filed with the Supervisors of East Donegal Township, therefore:

Section 1. The Borough Council hereby approves the said petition and the Borough of Mount Joy hereby annexes to the Borough the following described land situated in East Donegal Township, and adjoining the Borough, to wit:

ALL THAT CERTAIN lot or tract of land being situated on the west side of Penna. Legislative Route 649, being known as Marietta Avenue, and adjoining Mt. Joy Borough, being situated in East Donegal Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, said tract being more fully bounded and described as follows: BEGINNING at a point in Pennsylvania Legislative Route 649, said point being situated in the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township; thence extending in Pennsylvania Legislative Route 649 and extending along the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, South 33 degrees 43 minutes West, a distance of 100 feet to a point; thence extending along remaining lands of John Melhorn and leaving the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, North 71 degrees 00 minutes West, a distance of 1,357 feet to a point in line of land now or late of John F. Stoltzfus; thence along the same, North 24 degrees 48 minutes East, a distance of 740 feet to a point in line of West View Development, said point being a corner of the boundary between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township; thence extending along lands of West View Development and the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, North 24 degrees 06 minutes East, a distance of 327.60 feet to a point, a corner of land of John Melhorn; thence extending along the same and continuing along the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, South 71 degrees 00 minutes East, a distance of 1,122 feet to a point, a corner of Eberley Cemetery; thence along the same and leaving the boundary between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, South 22 degrees 00 minutes West, a distance of 366 feet to a point, a corner of the boundary line between Mt. Joy Borough and East Donegal Township, and being a corner of lands of John Melhorn; thence extending along lands of John Melhorn and extending along the boundary line between Mt. Joy Bor-

ough and East Donegal Township, South 02 degrees 45 minutes West, a distance of 625 feet to the point or place of BEGINNING. CONTAINING 29.8 acres.

Section 2. This annexation shall not be deemed to constitute an acceptance as a Borough Street, of any street or alley in the territory annexed, except such, if any, as now constitute public township roads in East Donegal Township.

Section 3. This annexation shall become effective at the time and in the manner prescribed by law, and when it so becomes effective, the annexed territory shall be part of the West Ward of the Borough and shall be zoned as a Residence "B" District under the Borough of Mount Joy Zoning Ordinance.

Fudge Is For Feasting!



When it comes to homemade candy—creamy-smooth chocolatey fudge is the all-time favorite! Perfect creamy-smoothness is assured in all candies when evaporated milk, the double-rich whole milk concentrate is used in the making. This streamlined recipe requires no thermometer and the basic syrup cooks in minutes. It's best to make a batch at a time, which poses no problem since it is speedily prepared. So for family feasting throughout the holidays—and as a special remembrance for friends and neighbors—make batches and batches of this real chocolatey, creamy fudge.

Quick and Easy Fudge

2 cups sugar	1 1/2 cups (9 oz.) semi-sweet chocolate pieces
3 tablespoons butter	1 teaspoon vanilla
1/4 teaspoon salt	2/3 cup chopped pecans
1 cup evaporated milk	
1/2 cup miniature marshmallows	

In a 2 or 3-quart saucepan combine sugar, butter, salt and evaporated milk. Stirring constantly, bring mixture to a full rolling boil over medium heat. Continue boiling and stirring for a full 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Add marshmallows, chocolate, vanilla and pecans. Stir vigorously or beat with spoon until marshmallows and chocolate are melted and smoothly blended. Turn into buttered 8-inch square pan. When candy is cold, cut into squares. Makes about 2 pounds.
