and elementary schools of the Donegal district.

Recently Mount Joy residents and business people have received from the Borough Planning Commission yellow, blank forms which are asking for information concerning various topics.

There are different forms for residents and for business and industry.

They all are part of the borough's recent move to have a comprehensive study made of the community and to have a look at its resources, its people and its probable growth.

One question, however, is worded unfortunately. It asks for the person who is making the report to indicate in which ward of the borough he lives and leaves blanks for 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Mount Joy's wards are East West and Florin. Local people should simply write at the bottom, near the blanks, either, East, West or Florin.

The blanks were made up by someone in Lancaster who did not know how Mount Joy designates its three voting wards.
