IN UNIFORM

Fireman Apprentice Ivan F. Wolgemuth Jr., USN, 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ivan F. Wolgemuth of 31 Mount Joy St., arrived in the South China Sea and participated in birthday celebrations aboard the guided-missile destroyer USS Parsons.
The entire crew celebrated the ship's first anniversary with a huge cake and an elaborate Sunday dinner.

Before it's commissioning in San Diego a year ago, Parsons was converted to a guided missile destroyer. Its superstructure was almost entirely removed along with the 5 inch 54 caliber gun mounts, and replaced with the Tartar Missile System, antisubmarine rocket missile system, and an all new electronics system.

The ship is presently operating with the N. S. Seventh Fleet as flagship for Commander Destroyer Squadron 31.

Church Names Intrim Pastor

Beginning the first Sunday in December, the Rev. Joe Willard Kreckler of Harrisburg will serve as part-time interim minister at the Gloss. Brenner U. M. church, Angle and Church streets.

Prior to that, he was a pastor for 20 years in the Susquehanna Conference at Williamsport, York, and Red Lion.

In student days, he did summer mission work in backwoods Congregational churches in Maine. He also was pastoral assistant to several churches in New York City. He is a graduate of Albright College, of New York Theological Seminary, and of Princeton Theological Seminary. In his ex-officio relationship to the Board of Missions, he has traveled in Asia and in the Caribbean. He is an honorary life member of the Associated Church Press.
