AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance establishing Weeping Alley in Mount Joy Borough a one-way street.

It is hereby ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lan-caster County, Pa., as fol-lows:

Section 1. Weeping Alley from Main Street to Henry Street, in the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., is hereby designated as a one-way street and veh-icular traffic thereon shall move in a southbound direc-tion.

Section 2. It shall be un-lawful to drive or operate any vehicle on said portion of Weeping Alley in a direction other than southbound. Any person who shall vio-late the provisions of this or-dinance, upon conviction thereof, before the Mayor or any Justice of the Peace of the borough, in a summary proceeding, shall pay a fine of not less than \$2.00 nor more than \$10.00, and costs of prosecution, and, in de-fault thereof, shall be sen-tenced to imprisonment in the Lancaster County Prison for a period not exceeding 5 days.

Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in-consistent herewith are here-by repealed.
