MEMO - Mount Joy - 1969

- 1.—Seriously consider the installation of curbs on West Main street through the Florin ward.
- 2.—Continue improvements of Wood Street, reconstructing one or two of the sections remaining after the 1968 project.
- 3.—Buy and regularly use a borough-owned street sweeper.
- 4.—Press for completion of the codification of borough ordinances.
- 5.—Enlarge the "Music in the Park" project.
- 6.—Start now to provide more water for our community, cooperating and participating with any agency which is interested in such a project.
- 7.—Improve the quality of water supplied by the municipal water system.
- 8.—Press for improvement on Manheim street between Mount Joy and the site of the new 230 Bypass interchange, including the drainage problems in the area of the Little Chiques creek bridge.
- 9.—Take steps to insure that property within the borough has fire plugs located within reasonable protection ranges.
- 10.—Encourage public and/or private capital to launch a tourist attraction which will put Mount Joy "on the map."
