

- 8.—Press for improvement on Manheim street between Mount Joy and the site of the new 230 Bypass interchange, including the drainage problems in the area of the Little Chiques creek bridge.
- 9—Take steps to insure that property within the borough has fire plugs located within reasonable protection ranges.
- 10.—Encourage public and/or private capital to launch a tourist attraction which will put Mount Joy "on the map."
