ONE IDEA OF GOD

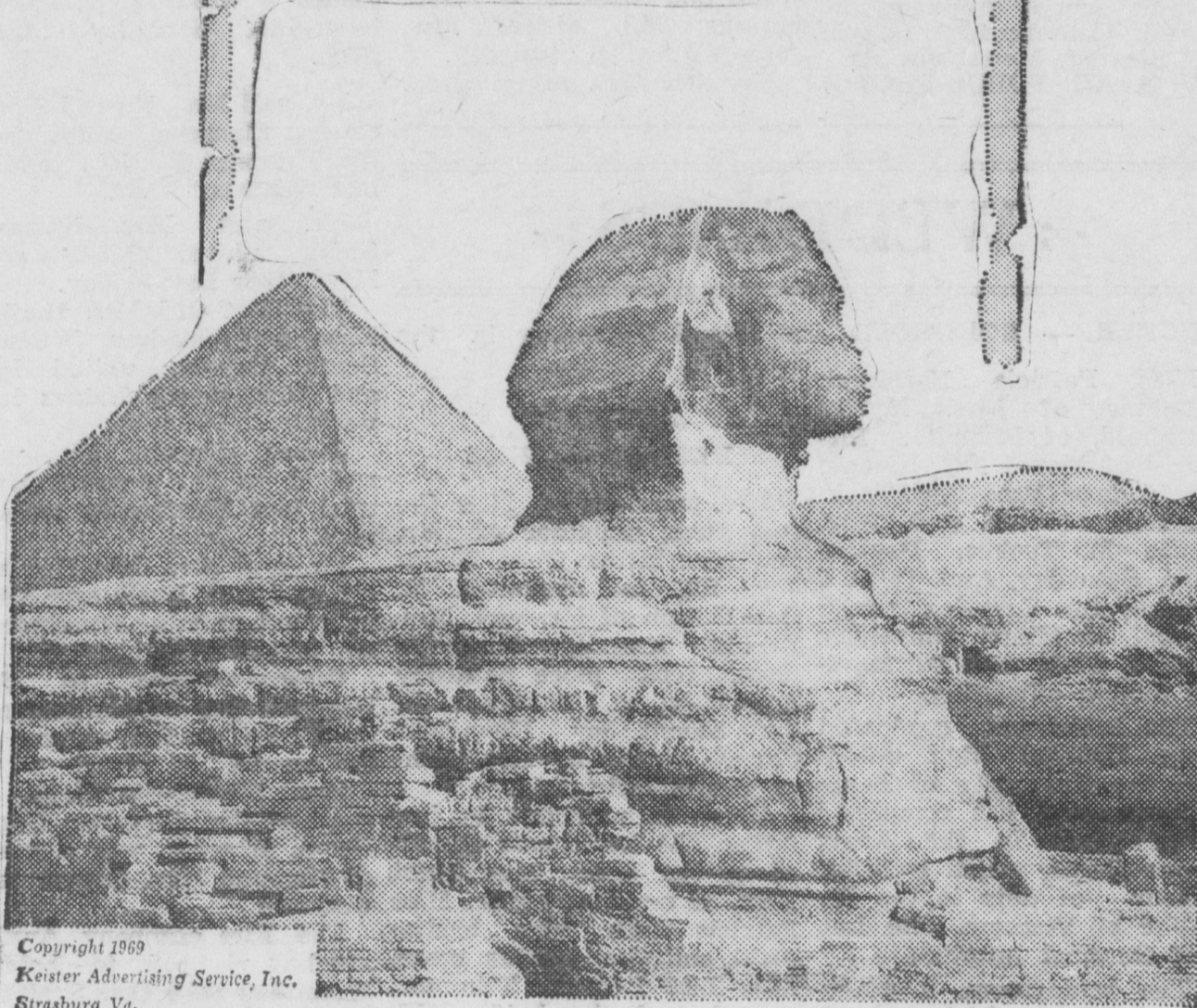
At the entrance to the valley where they buried their kings an ancient and industrious people carved the Sphinx.
