Area Study Moves Along

The Lancaster County Planning Commission has announced that the Donegal Area Planning Study is expected to reach fifty percent completion by December.

To date, the commission, which has been retained as a consultant in a joint plan being developed for Marietta and Mount Joy Boroughs and East Donegal Township, has completed eight of the ten background study elements. The remaining two, concerning community facilities and transportation, are to be completed shortly.

In addition to the background elements, the base mapping also has been completed.

Once this section is completed, work can proceed on the comprehensive plan itself. The plan will include sections dealing with purpose and goals, future land use, future transportation network, future community facilities, and implementation.

The completed document will be designed to contain the official expression of policies of the township and the two boroughs. It is designed to provide the necessary factual data and statement of goals and development policies which are required for guiding future growth and development.

Plan Annual Stamp Show

The Mount Joy Stamp club will hold its annual stamp show from Nov. 14 to 21 at the Union National Bank in Mount Joy.

The show is being held during the National Stamp Collecting Week, which is from Nov. 17 to 23. This year's national theme is "The Golden Jubilee of International Air Mail."

First air mail stamp was issued in Italy in 1917. From that time until very recently, with the space flight to the moon, there have been hundreds of air mail stamps issued all over the world. A complete collection of all the air mail stamps would be valued in the thousands of dollars. However, there are only a few that cost in the hundred and thousand dollar range.

Stamp collecting is not limited to air mail stamps only. Any stamp that is used for the delivery of mail is collectable. A lot of collectors have stamps of only one country or of all over the world. Some specialize in the postmark on the envelope or the first day of issue of a stamp. Still others go into different subjects on stamps; like flowers, birds, sports, automobiles, churches, Christ, scouting, butterflies, insects, and almost anything that a stamp has for a subject. The latest and one of the most popular subjects is on space flights and President Eisenhower.

One of the best ways to learn more about the how and why of stamp collecting and stamps is to visit a stamp club.

The Mount Joy stamp club meets at the Mount Joy fire hall the fourth Tuesday of every month except in December. If anyone wants more information about the Mount Joy Stamp Club, he should contact Joseph Shaeffer in Mount Joy or Mrs. Myrtle Brown in Elizabethtown.

ARTICHOKES WITH WHIPPED BACON BUTTER
 4 artichokes, prepared as directed
 1/2 cup butter, softened
 1/2 cup heavy cream
 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
 1/4 teaspoon each: dry mustard, thyme
 4 slices bacon, cooked crisp and crumbled
 Paprika
 Cream butter until light and fluffy; gradually beat in cream. Stir in onion powder, mustard, thyme and bacon. Sprinkle with paprika. Serve as dip with hot artichokes. Four servings.
