Her fiance, a graduate of Hempfield high school, is a sophomore at Elizabethtown College. He is employed by Johnston's Pharmacy, Landisville.

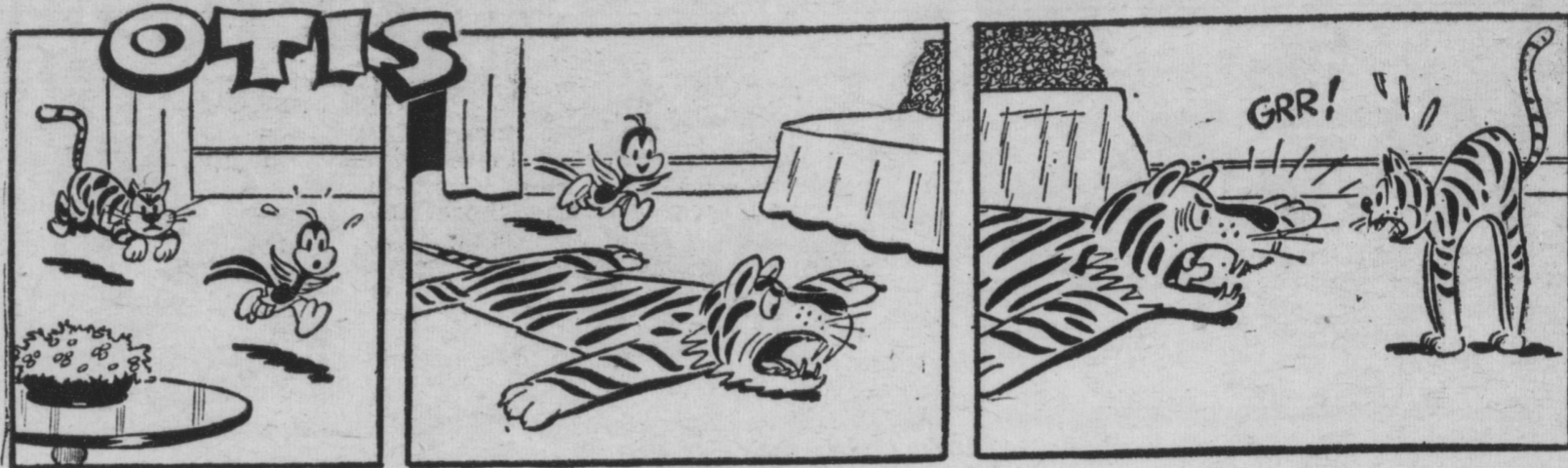
