GOOD NUTRITION

Poor diet can often be the cause of poor health. Leading nutritionists recommend a balanced diet which includes: 2 glasses of a milk a day; enriched bread with riboflavin and wheat germ; broiled liver twice a month; broiled — rather than fried — meats, fish, and fowl; raw fruits; and yellow and green vegetables. Avoid candy, cake, fatty meat, crunchy snacks, and convenience foods. For between meal hunger, eat fruits and vegetables.

CANCER'S WARNINGS

In addition to a yearly physical examination by your doctor, familiarize yourself with cancer's seven danger signals which include: unusual bleeding or discharge, a lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere, a sore that does not heal, a change in bowel or bladder habits, hoarseness or cough, indigestion or difficulty swallowing, and a change in the size or color of a wart or mole. If a signal lasts longer than two weeks, see your physician without delay.
