Ladies Auxiliary of the Walter S. Ebersole American Legion Post 185 held their first meeting of the season on Thursday, September 3 at 7 p.m. at the Post Home.

The East Hempfield Planning Commission and township supervisors met recently and approved the plan for a 5½ acre industrial zoned lot owned by T & H on the Rohrerstown Road north of the Rt. 30 by-pass. The plan for 15 lots in six acres owned by Millcreek Estates and Eastside Drive off Nolt Road.
 In other action the supervisors approved a planning commission recommendation that the township proceed with work of updating the zoning ordinance and revising the comprehensive plan.
 The supervisors also reappointed Raymond Miller to another 5-year term on the planning commission.

On Tuesday evening, September 15 at 8 p.m. in the Landisville fire hall the Hempfield Women's club will hold a special birthday night. This will be the first meeting of the new season.

The police also reported 44 traffic arrests, 13 traffic investigations, 20 neighborhood complaints, 9 stolen bicycles, 1 stolen motor vehicle, four complaints of prowlers or peeping toms, 13 cases of larceny, 2 burglaries, 6 dog complaints, and 5 cases involving bad checks.

As required by Section 2431 of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended, a report of the audit was filed August 31, 1970 in the office of the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and the said report will be confirmed absolutely unless appeal is taken therefrom within thirty days after the filing thereof.

In our opinion, the balance sheets and related statements of revenues, expenditures, and fund equities as presented below present fairly the financial position of each of the several funds of DONEGAL SCHOOL DISTRICT on June 30, 1970, and the results of their operation for the year then ended, in conformity with the principles and procedures legally established for Pennsylvania school systems.
