Miss Fague has had a full schedule, spending days and nights in the Clearfield, Milton, Bloomsburg, Hanover, Williamsport and York areas. She has met with congregational groups and clusters, shared in family night programs, church council meetings and planning sessions of organizations. She also has addressed public school and tech-school classes, service clubs and community gatherings, visited social ministry institutions and participated in retreats and pastors' meetings. Before her tenure in Central Pennsylvania is completed, Miss Fague will have been present in all areas of the synod.
