DATE WAFFLES 2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking soda 3 teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup sugar

I teaspoon ground nutmeg I cup finely chopped fresh California dates

1/2 cup finely chopped nuts 3 egg yolks

13/4 cups buttermilk

1/2 cup melted butter or

margarine 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Combine flour, baking soda, salt, sugar, nutmeg, fresh dates and nuts. Beat egg yolk with buttermilk and butter. Add liquid all at once into dry ingredients. Beat until smooth. Fold in egg whites. Spoon 1½ cups batter into preheated, greased, 9-inchsquare waffle iron. Bake to desired degree of doneness. Serve waffles hot with pats of butter, heated maple syrup and sausages. Makes four
