Virginia Swim League, the Junior Olympics and AAU.

Jim broke four records in the NVSL which consists of 72 swim clubs. He swam the 50 yard freestyle in 24.5 seconds to better a 10 year old record by 4 tenths of a second. His 58.9 seconds for the 100 meter freestyle broke a 1965 record by 4 tenths of a second. His other two records were 28.6 seconds in the fifty yard backstroke and 320 seconds in the 50 meter backstroke.

Jim qualified for the Junior Olympic Regional championship held in Pittsburgh earlier this year and finished second in the 100 meter backstroke and 3rd in the 100 meter freestyle

In the AAU competition, Jim swam with the Starlit Aquatic Club of Fairfax, Va. He works out every morning and evening for a total of 3 hours and practices with his high school team on Saturday and Sunday when he isn't competing in AAU events.

His objective is to qualify for the National Championships, Pan American Games and the ultimate—the Olympics.
