## Citizens Oppose Plant Operation

Twenty citizens recently opposed expansion of the U. S. Aluminum operations in Marietta borough, and the borough's zoning board postponed a decision on whether to allow the firm to build a hammer mill on Hazel Ave.

In response to charges against U. S. Aluminum that the firm had contributed to noise and air pollution in the borough, Gary Gillham, chairman of the zoning board, said the present decision could not be based on past performance by the company.

The comments were made at a public hearing on the request.

One citizen said he felt that if the special exception to allow the plant expansion is granted by the zoning board, there also should be a posting of performance bonds by the company to guarantee a reduction in air pollution and noise.

The board has 45 days to reach a decision in the case, but Gillham said it should not take that long to reach a decision.
